Thank you very much to Angus Mylles for agreeing to take on this position.

As many of you already know members of the committee have been working hard over the last two months to ensure that our U3A complies with the new General Data Protection Regulations. I would particularly like to thank David Ackroyd, Tony Barker and Chris Collins for helping me to draft a Data Protection Policy, a Privacy Policy and a new Application Form. At the risk of boring you all, (and believe me I have read and heard enough about GDPR to last me a lifetime!) I do need to ensure that all members are aware of the implications of the changes. Once the regulations come into force we need to have your explicit consent to store your data. In order to achieve this we will be issuing personalised membership renewal forms. This will also give you the opportunity to check that the information which we hold is correct. We shall be giving out the renewal forms at the General Meetings in March and we will be encouraging you to sign the forms and return them at the end of the meeting. The rest of the forms will be delivered either by hand or post. Please help us by returning the forms promptly. The Data Protection Policy and Privacy Policy are available for you to read on our website. If you normally receive a paper newsletter then you will be given paper copies of the two policies when you renew your membership.

Another consequence of GDPR is that we can no longer hold ICE details on our database. All the information which we collected from you has now been deleted. Instead we are giving out ICE cards for you to keep with you and we would like you to have them with you whenever you are at a U3A event. It is particularly important that the members of the more 'active' groups such as walking and cycling have their ICE cards with them. In any case it is a good idea to have the card with you at all times, as it is designed to be useful to the Emergency Services. If you have not yet been given a card, do not worry. Group Leaders will have cards, they will also be available at General Meetings and on outings.

The new Data Protection Regulations should not cause you any concern. The changes are intended to ensure that all organisations (not just U3As) keep our personal information securely.

Monday 12th and Thursday 15th March: Tales of a Scotland Yard Detective

Our March speaker is Steve Roberts, a former Detective Inspector with the Metropolitan Police. Starting out "on the beat" in the East End of London - once the home of the likes of Jack the Ripper and the Kray twins, but now uber-trendy - Steve soon became a detective, making his way to the Flying Squad which brought him into contact with professional hardened armed robbers. During his 30 years' service, he worked at various locations and at New Scotland Yard on a number of specialist investigation units including service in the Flying Squad and the Kidnap and Specialist Investigation Unit. Steve has many stories of investigations and arrests as well as insights into the criminal mind.

Monday 9th and Thursday 19th April: Up The Mountain, But Not Over the Hill

April's speaker, Janette Taylor, presents an illustrated talk on her experiences as a medical research volunteer trekking up to, and camping at, Everest Base Camp. Jan's talk outlines the purpose of medical research to discover how to best improve intensive care patients' outcomes. Often intensive care patients suffer from inadequate circulation of oxygen to the major organs. In this research, healthy volunteers are tested in a naturally low oxygen environment to see how well they cope with low oxygen levels


Spanish Treasures: Spanish Paintings at the National Gallery, 13 March 2018


