Rousham House & Gardens – Tuesday 22 May 2018

The house, built in 1635 by Sir Robert Dormer, is still in the ownership of the same family. William Kent 1685-1748 added the wings and the stable block. The south front is almost as Kent left it. Kent made alterations to the interior of the house, which retains some 17th century paneling and the original staircases, furniture, pictures and bronzes. The garden at Rousham represents the first phase of English landscape design and also remains almost as Kent left it.

Sulgrave Manor, George Washington's ancestral home – Thursday 21 June 2018

Sulgrave Manor was built by Lawrence Washington, George's five times great grandfather in the mid-1500s. The original Tudor features include the Great Hall where Lawrence, his wife and eleven children lived. Other original elements include the entrance porch, the Great Chamber and two smaller rooms on the first floor. In 1700 a North Wing was added. The garden remains largely unaltered since this time with formal hedges and topiary, an orchard, herb garden and beautiful borders for all seasons.

Thames Valley Network Study Days

The Work of William Morris - Kelmscott Manor - 10 May

Kelmscott Manor is a limestone manor in the Cotswold village of Kelmscott, near Lechlade. It dates from around 1570, with a late 17th-century wing, and is Grade I listed. .It is probably the most evocative of all the houses associated with Morris and contains an outstanding collection of the possessions and works of Morris, his family and his Arts & Crafts associates, including furniture, original textiles, pictures, carpets, ceramics and metalwork.

17th May - Study Day "Inspiring Photography"

The study day aims to inspire you to improve the composition of your photographs whether you are using the camera on your phone or a top-of-the-range Digital Single Lens Reflex. The talks will focus on recognising the best photos to take and how to capture them, then what you can do with those photographs.

This event takes place in the stunning setting of the Thames Room of the River and Rowing Museum, Henley, looking out over the river.
